Desert Voices' mission is to teach each child who is deaf or hard of hearing the oral language skills needed to talk and to understand when being spoken to. Our goal is to prepare the children and their family to mainstream into their school of choice with hearing children the same age.

PROGRAMS



PARENT COACHING

Parent Coaching is a weekly individual session led by a listening and spoken language professional with the child and a parent/grandparent/caregiver. This setting provides coaching to help the caregiver understand their child's learning potential using listening and spoken language and to build the foundation to be successful in an educational setting. The individualized session also allows caregivers to understand their child's hearing loss, practice strategies to support their child's listening and spoken language at home and in their community, and receive individualized counseling. Professionals collaborate with the family, the audiologist, the ENT, and other outside team members to ensure the child is progressing in all areas of development and has appropriate access to sound to optimize the child's development of listening and spoken language.

JUMP START

Jump Start is a weekly two hour group class led by listening and spoken language professionals. This classroom setting builds on the foundation of Parent Coaching sessions and provides multiple opportunities for both the child and the parent/caregiver to practice and improve their listening and spoken language skills. This group setting allows children to begin to learn the routine of a classroom, continue to develop their listening/auditory skills, build receptive vocabulary, and begin imitating words. Parents and caregivers can practice strategies in a community setting while they build relationships with other parents and learn more about their child's needs in an educational setting.


TODDLER

Toddler class meets twice a week for 3.5 hours per day and is led by a listening and spoken language (LSL) professional. This time includes 30 minutes of one-on-one instruction with a LSL professional, typically a speech-language pathologist. In this language-rich environment, children develop their vocabulary, building their word bank to about 250 words. They learn to combine words and chat with their classmates. All parts of the day ensure that the child can increase their vocabulary and focus on expressive and receptive language. The skills learned in Toddler Class provide the child with the confidence in language skills, vocabulary, and school readiness skills needed to enter the next program.

PRESCHOOL

Preschool classes meet Monday through Friday for 6.5 hours per day. Children alternate between two different settings, both focusing on communication skills. In small groups children, a listening and spoken language professional provides direct language instruction focusing vocabulary, syntax, conversational on language, articulation, auditory training, and language enrichment. The small student to teacher ratio gives each child multiple opportunities to practice syntactically correct language. Children also engage in a larger group setting with up to fifteen children as part of their preschool day. This setting focuses on positive social and emotional skills, fine and gross motor development, pragmatic use of language, literacy and school readiness skills. The preschool offers the opportunity for a child to become fully immersed in an educational setting taught through oral instruction.
